Sunapee to add track

SMHS teacher Jon Reed will coach the Lakers in their first season this spring

SUNAPEE - Track and field is a reality at Sunapee Middle High School. Athletic Director Tom Frederick recently announced the addition to the spring athletic options at Sunapee.

"A parent made a request last year and we thought it would be a good idea," Frederick said. "It gives some other kids who do not play softball or baseball the chance to participate in a sport in the spring."

Selected to coach the inaugural season of the track squad is SMHS teacher Jon Reed.

"We're launching the program," Reed said. "I'm very excited about the start of the season."

Reed, in addition to his duties as the varsity track coach, will also lead a middle school squad.

"We're looking at 15-20 kids at the high school level and another 15 or so at the middle school," Reed said. "It is very much an individual sport and will give kids a great opportunity in the spring."

A track team will also be an opportunity for baseball and softball players to add another sport in the spring.

"We're going to allow kids to compete in track events who already play a spring sport," Reed said. "I keep in constant

contact with Coach Cruz (softball) and Coach Frederick (baseball) so there is not going to be any conflict. I think we have a few kids interested."

Reed was a track athlete for two years at Bromfield High School in Harvard, Mass.

"I was mostly a runner, but I did do javelin," Reed said.

Reed has served as the girls junior varsity soccer coach for two seasons at Sunapee and before that coached a lot of youth sports.

The Lakers will have an interesting first

season as there is no track facility in Sunapee.

"We'd love to have a track in Sunapee," Frederick said. "I think we need to look at long-term plans for all of our outdoor athletic facilities."

The local track community has come to the rescue so the Lakers will have the opportunity to use an existing track for some practices.

"Area schools have stepped up to help us out," Reed said. "I've spoken with Newport, Kearsarge and Colby-Sawyer and they are going to let us use their facilities when they are not using them."

Reed is planning to try a few innovative ways to train his team without a track.

"We'll be doing what I like to call a lot of non-traditional practices," Reed said. "We'll run on grass fields, parking lots, beaches and we'll do throwing events in some of our fields."

The school has purchased starting blocks and hurdles so they can practice starting and hurdle events.

Reed feels fortunate that he is in the school every day because his goal is to entice more kids, who do not participate in a spring sport, to give track and field a try.

"It really allows me the opportunity to talk it up with the kids," Reed said. "So far the interest from the kids has been

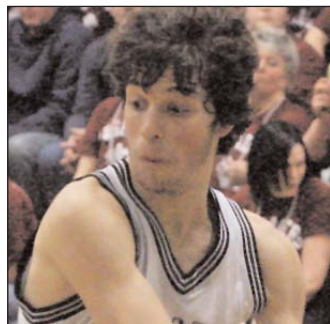

Mohawks end Lakers season

No. 5 Sunapee falls at No. 4 Colebrook in Class S quarterfinals March 6

COLEBROOK, N.H. - A super season for the Sunapee Lakers came to end in the Class S boys basketball quarterfinals. The fifth-seeded Lakers lost to the fourth-seeded Colebrook Mohawks 63-51 March 6.

Colebrook ended up losing to eventual Class S champion Moultonborough 78-47 in the semifinals.

Sunapee stayed tight to the hosts for the first half, but Colebrook's trapping halfcourt defense wore down the Lakers in the second half as the effects of the long bus ride kicked in for the visitors.

The Lakers led 15-12 after one quarter as they came out with a lot of energy, but Colebrook rebounded and went into the break with a 28-27 lead. The Mohawks increased their lead to 46-38 after three quarters.

Alex Elder exploited Colebrook's lack of size in the paint to lead all scorers with 23 points, but the Mohawks countered with Tyler Griffin's 22 points.

Sunapee's Thilo Herbert added eight points and Dean Gioldassis seven.

The Lakers finish their season at 13-5.

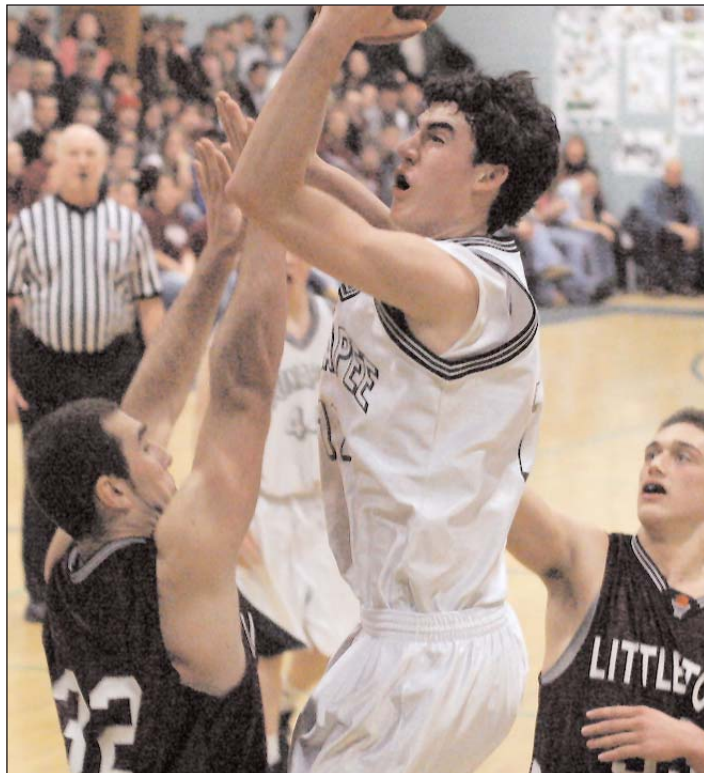
